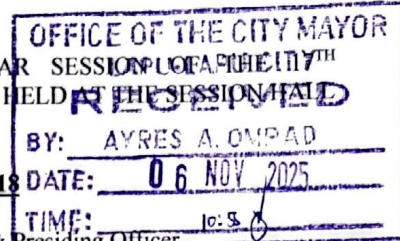

RESOLUTION NO. 17-0793-2025

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING LAPU-LAPU CITY UNDER A STATE OF
CALAMITY DUE TO THE EFFECTS OF TYPHOON TINO AUTHORIZING
THE UTILIZATION OF AVAILABLE CITY AND BARANGAY CALAMITY
FUNDS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, Lapu-Lapu City was placed under Typhoon Signal No. 4 by PAG-ASA as it was included in the estimated path of Typhoon Tino;

WHEREAS, as of Pag-asa Tropical Cyclone Bulletin issued at 2:00 A.M on November 4, 2025, Typhoon Tino had maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h, gustiness of up to 205 km/h. and could bring 200 mm of rainfall within a 24 hour period. The typhoon also provided a high risk of life-threatening and damaging storm surge for coastal areas;



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WHEREAS, the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CDRRMC) has conducted damage assessment and needs analysis and has recommended the declaration of State of Calamity in Lapu-Lapu City to facilitate immediate relief, rehabilitation and recovery operations;

WHEREAS, a state of imminent disaster maybe declared when there is serious threat of an impending hazards which was earlier declared by the 17th Sangguniang Panlungsod prior to the landfall of Typhoon Tino;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7 of Republic Act 12287, the declaration of a State of Imminent Disaster is automatically lifted upon the occurrence of the hazard event;

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of the typhoon, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council was convened to discuss the situation of the City and approved Resolution No. 11-5 s25, a Resolution Declaring a State of Calamity in the Lapu-Lapu City Due to the Effects of Typhoon Tino Authorizing the Utilization of the Available City and Barangay Calamity Funds and for Other Purposes;

WHEREAS, the following information were provided during the meeting:

- The typhoon has caused heavy rainfall starting at 1:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. yesterday, which in turn caused flooding in public and residential areas within the City;
- At least 8,000 families or about 31,000 individuals were placed under pre-emptive evacuations;
- As early as November 3, 2025, the City Government together with the other LGUs in Metro Cebu and Cebu Provincial Government ordered work suspensions. This in turn, caused livelihood disruptions for majority of the city's population. Moreover, due to the gale warning and risk of storm surge, all fisherfolks were prohibited from fishing;
- In addition, there was disruption of transport, specifically sea travel to and from Olango Island and the islets of Pangan-an, Caubian and Caohagan, which disrupted the transport of food and other essential supplies. This is another disruption of livelihood and lifelines;
- There were also disruptions of critical lifelines particularly power and water supply in both the mainland and Olango Island. The strong winds toppled over electrical and utility poles, which caused city-wide power interruption. The lack of power also caused water supply to be cut-off;



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- The typhoon also broke and toppled over trees and branches in the city's streets, which caused obstructions. However, the swift clearing operations by the city and barangays paved the way for the debris' immediate removal;
- There were also reports online that there are certain establishments that imposed unreasonable increase of prices of their commodities;
- Per initial reports, the following government structures incurred damages due to the typhoon:
 - Looc National High School
 - Punta Engano Elementary School
 - Lapu-lapu City College
 - Lapu-lapu City Hall
 - Lapu-lapu City Auditorium
 - Abattoir
- There are reported houses that were partially or totally damaged in several barangays.

WHEREAS, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (DRRMO) together with other concerned offices and agencies are currently conducting an assessment of the damage of the typhoon most especially identifying the damaged structures and residential areas which are partially or fully damaged;

WHEREAS, there is disruption of livelihood. The fish cages of Barangays Ibo and Calawisan and prematurely harvesting of bangus in barangays Caohagan, Suba-Basbas and Mactan and about 15,000 pieces were dead. In barangay Pangan-an, there were fish cages that were totally damaged with about 8,000 fingerlings. In Barangay Buaya, there were fish cages that were totally damaged with around 10,000 fishes. In Barangay Suba-basbas, there were fish cages that were partially damaged with around 15,000 fishes. In Barangay Ibo, there were fish pens that were partially damaged. In Barangay Calawisan, there were fish pens that were partially damaged. The Guso farming in Barangays Buaya, Ibo, Pangan-an, Caohagan, and San Vicente were totally wiped out;

WHEREAS, with the declaration of State of Calamity, affected residents can apply for calamity loans from GSIS, SSS, PAG-IBIG, etc.;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Marciano A. Alforque, Jr. duly seconded en masse,



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RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to declare Lapu-Lapu City under a State of Calamity due to the effects of Typhoon Tino authorizing the utilization of available city and barangay calamity funds, and for other purposes, upon the recommendation of the City Mayor and the Lapu-Lapu City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this Body also recognizes and includes in the resolution the automatic price freeze on basic necessities provided under Republic Act 7581 otherwise known as the Price Act. Under the law, the prices of basic necessities shall be automatically frozen at their prevailing prices at the time of the declaration of the State of Calamity. This will ensure that prevailing prices of basic goods and necessities remain stable and reasonable for our constituents during the period following the resolution.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that a copy of this resolution be furnished, the City Mayor, the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), the Lapu-Lapu City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council, the DILG and all others concerned, for their information.

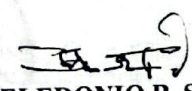
